EXAM RULES

- 1. The exam is administered in the School of Foreign Languages building. Each candidate should learn the classroom where they will sit the exam through the lists posted on the bulletin boards in the same building on the day of the exam. Therefore, it is advised that the candidates arrive at the exam venue one hour before the exam.
- 2. The candidates who will take the exam must be present at the exam room at least 15 minutes before the exam starts to complete the necessary coding on their optic answer sheets.
- 3. The candidates who are more than 15 minutes late for the exam are not allowed to take the exam.
- 4. Candidates cannot leave the exam room in the first 30 minutes and the last 10 minutes of the exam. The candidates who leave the exam room outside the specified limits mentioned above aren't allowed to come back to the exam venue by any means.
- 5. It is mandatory that candidates have their student ID cards provided by Başkent University, (or national ID cards, driver's license) soft lead pencils and erasers.
- 6. It is strictly forbidden that candidates take the exam with electronic communication devices, (cellphones, i-pads...etc.) computers and all kinds of technological devices that have the same function as computers, books, notebooks, dictionaries etc. Before the exam starts, candidates must turn off their cellphones and hand them in to the invigilators.
- 7. The scores of candidates who attempt to cheat or send a proxy test taker to complete the exam on their behalf will be cancelled. An incident report will be held and disciplinary action will be taken against these candidates.
- 8. All candidates must fully comply with the invigilator's directions during the exam.
- 9. The exam consists of two booklets: The Proficiency Booklet and the Proficiency-Writing Booklet. Both booklets are distributed at the beginning of the exam and there is no break in between.
- 10. The students who will study at Program of American Culture and Literature, Department of Foreign Languages Education, Department of Translation and Interpretation, Faculty of Medicine and Faculty of Dentistry also have to take a speaking exam. To get information about the date, duration and exam room of the Speaking Exam students must follow the announcements on the 'School of Foreign Languages' website.

And in time, he got a promotion in his career in the imaginary story of himself: he became a second lieutenant, then a first lieutenant, then a major.

When Tully went to military meetings as a reporter, he would dress in a military uniform. As he became more comfortable with the uniform and his stories about the 20 Air Force, he began to wear medals of honour. This imaginary life got to such a point where Tully himself could not tell the difference between fact and fiction.

As Tully was doing well in his reporting business, people trusted and respected him as a soldier, too. He was always careful and consistent when he talked about his "military" adventures; he told believable stories. By doing this, he deceived everyone 25 for many years.

But then something changed Tully's whole life. In his newspaper, he published some negative articles about a well-known lawyer of his city. The lawyer became very angry with Tully and he decided to investigate Tully's personal life. Soon, he discovered that Tully was a liar. He **publicize**d the fact that Tully told untrue stories about himself. In 30 this way, everybody learnt about the real Tully.

Tully immediately admitted being dishonest and resigned from his job. He put himself in the care of a psychiatrist in order to discover why he did this. And the fantasy life style of "Duke" Tully ended.
