

EXAM RULES AND PROCEDURES

1. The exam is applied in the School of Foreign Languages building. Each candidate will learn the classroom code where they will sit the exam through the lists that will be posted on the bulletin boards in the same building and the day of the exam. Therefore, it is advised that candidates arrive at the exam building early in the morning.
2. The candidates who will take the exam must appear at the exam room at least 15 minutes before the exam starts to complete the necessary coding on their optic answers sheets.
3. The candidates who are 15 minutes late for the exam aren't allowed to take the exam.
4. Candidates can't leave the exam room in the first 30 minutes and the last 10 minutes of the exam. The candidates who leave the exam room outside the specified limits above aren't allowed to come back to the exam hall by any means. Approximately 150 minutes which is the total duration of the two exam booklets will be used as a block. The first 30 minutes and the last 10 minutes are calculated according to the 150 minute period.
5. It is mandatory that candidates have their student ID cards provided by Başkent University (or citizenship card, driver's licence), soft-lead pencils and erasers.
6. It is strictly forbidden that candidates take the exam with any electronic communication devices (cellphones, etc.), computers and all kinds of technological devices that have the same function as computer, books, notebooks, dictionary, etc. Before the exam starts, candidates must turn off their cellphones and deliver them to the invigilators.
7. Candidates who attempt to cheat or put someone else to the exam instead of themselves will have "0" point as their exam results. The statement will be taken down and disciplinary action will be taken against these candidates.
8. During the exam, all candidates must fully comply with the invigilators' directions.
9. As seen below, the exam consists of two booklets. ('Writing' section of the 'Proficiency' booklet is distributed to the candidates separately.) Both of the booklets will be distributed one after the other and there won't be any break time in between. Therefore, candidates aren't allowed to enter the exam room between the distribution of the booklets.
10. Each booklet will be assessed separately. The score results of the booklets will not be added to each other.
11. Firstly, 'Proficiency' booklet will be assessed. Students who have succeeded at 'Proficiency' can start studying at their faculties/ institutions directly. The students who fail will be placed to the suitable level in the English Preparatory Department according to the score that students have in the 'Placement' booklets. Therefore, students must do both of the booklets.
12. For both of the booklets, the success criterion is %60 for the students who will study at the departments which the medium of instruction is %30 English. The success criterion is %70 for the students who will study at the departments of which the medium of instruction is %100 English.
13. Additionally, a speaking exam is applied for the students who will study at American Culture and Literature, English Language Teaching, Translation and Interpreting. To get information about the date, duration and place of the Speaking exam, students must follow the announcements on our "School of Foreign Languages" website.
