- 1 We hope you enjoy your stay at the Mountain Shadow Hostel here in Snowdonia. My name's Kara and it's my job to make sure you have fun and stay safe on your trip to this beautiful part of Wales.
- 2 We have lots of activities that you can take part in, including walking (of course!), rafting, pony trekking and climbing. We have some expert guides here who can take you on some wonderful hikes. These walks can be all levels from easy to challenging, depending on your ages and ability. But whatever path you take, you can be sure that you will see some spectacular scenery as you walk down deep valleys, climb to snow-covered peaks or trek rocky coastal paths.
- 3 The kind of equipment you should bring will obviously depend on the time of year that you decide to come. However, Snowdonia is famous for certain types of weather! So I do recommend that you bring a waterproof jacket, a warm jumper and good walking boots. In the summer, mosquitoes can be a problem so insect repellent would be a good idea. Believe it or not, you should bring sunscreen too! Any special equipment like tents, sleeping bags and camping stoves will be provided. For those of you who enjoy birdwatching, it might be a good idea to bring your binoculars as we have a huge variety of different species here for you to keep an eye out for.
- 4 Food will be provided for you at mealtimes. There is a basic breakfast which includes coffee, tea, homemade bread rolls, cereals and toast. Packed lunches will be prepared for you to take on your daily activities, and each night dinner is served at seven o'clock. If you don't eat meat, or have other particular dietary requirements, you should let us know as soon as possible so that we can provide something different for you. For evening entertainment, we have a games room with a table tennis and pool table. There is a TV room with lots of videos to choose from and there is also a library. In the village there is a very good café where you will be very welcome.
- 5 Finally, we ask that everyone keeps the noise to a minimum after 10.30 p.m. Could you please take out the rubbish from your dormitories every night, and please use the recycle bins for your bottles and plastics. A daily itinerary is given out every evening with the following day's schedule. Could everyone try to be on time and remember to respect the staff when dealing with them?

- 1 People say that moving house is one of the most stressful things you can do, but the Anderson family didn't just move house, they moved continents. We talked to them about their experiences travelling the 7,000 miles from England to Indonesia.
- 2 So, why did they decide to move halfway around the world? Jenny Anderson loves animals and wanted to help protect them. She was studying for her PhD in Animal Conservation and was very interested in the orangutans of the Sumatran rainforest. 'I wrote lots of emails to an organisation there, asking questions for my research,' Jenny remembers. 'Then one day, they asked if I was interested in working with them. I was so surprised!' Of course, she wanted to go, but she had to think about her family first. Len, her husband, was working in a job he enjoyed. He was an engineer for a large oil company. They also had two children: Keira who was six, and Ben who was four. But Len knew that this was a fantastic opportunity for Jenny. After some thought, he decided he'd quite like to explore somewhere new and interesting. 'Let's do it,' he said. Was it very different in Indonesia? 'Of course, it was so much hotter than the UK,' says Jenny. 'It was 25 degrees Celsius even in the wet season. And the rain was the heaviest I've ever seen.' The house where they were living was on a street which flooded when it rained, and it rained a lot. They sometimes had to walk in water up to their knees when they went out shopping. 'We didn't have hot water and there was no shower,' says Len. 'We had to fill a bucket with water and use that to wash.' They wondered if they had made a big mistake in leaving their lovely home in England. They even had a few conversations about returning. 'Everything was so different,' says Jenny. 'The roads were more crowded, the food was spicier and everywhere was louder than we were used to.'
- 3 So, did they regret their decision to move to the other side of the world? 'Not at all,' says Len. 'After a couple of weeks, we began to enjoy the differences. The people are much friendlier here than in the United Kingdom. They are so interested in our lives.' Jenny agrees, 'Yes, the Indonesians are the nicest people I've ever met. And I love my job, too. Keira and Ben are growing up near the rainforest and see orangutans, elephants and monkeys all the time. 'Their friends back home enjoy seeing photos of the animals.' They aren't planning to move back to England yet, then? 'Not yet,' says Jenny. 'But it is nice to go home for a visit sometimes.'
